Historic Garden Update

Several new steps will be taken by Master Gardeners Niles and Barb Klaves at the Centreville Settlement Lutze Housebarn Historic Garden this year. More work will be done on the garden expansion areas this spring, breaking up the soil and adding more compost. Part of the expansion area will be planted with demonstration farm crops: wheat, oats and rye.

Niles reported that in addition to using heirloom seeds they will be adding strawberries and several varieties of German tomatoes. The grape vines have been pruned and are now approaching their seventh year of production. Rhubarb was first picked on May 7th to make savory pies.

The Bake Oven Day Event: Full of Flavors, Aromas and Fellowship

After an intense morning cleaning the livestock area of the Housebarn May 7th, volunteers traveled south on Union Road to Mrs. Klessig's farmstead where the historic bake oven is housed. There were nearly 20+ loaves of homemade bread baked-cranberry walnut cinnamon, sunflower, flaxseed and wheat berry, whole wheat bread, and pecan-raisin chocolate breads. The delicious customized pizzas made by the members, topped with fresh oregano, ramps, morels, olives, onions, pepperoni, fennel, basil, Italian venison sausage, and several kinds of delicious cheeses. Chris Kuehnel was the lead baker for the wood fired oven, just like they used in the 1850's. All enjoyed stories, reminiscing and a few songs. Thanks Margret!
